Otay Water District Announces *Thankful for Water* and *Drink Tap December*Instagram Photo Contests

The District will also upload contest entry photos to its @otaywater Instagram page where Otay will count the total number of "likes" from friends, family and the public at large for each contest through Jan. 2.

Two winners from each contest will be awarded a first place \$75 gift card and a second place \$50 gift card according to the most "likes" received on @otaywater by Jan. 2. District staff will select two additional winners from each contest based on theme, originality and creativity, which the first-place winner will win a \$75 gift card and the second-place winner, a \$50 gift card.
